

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

This building is a two-and-a-half story front gable and wing residence. One brick chimney stands at the interior center of the building. The foundation is made of concrete and brick. The facade has an open gable entrance with two columns and an asymmetrical window arrangement. The building is four bays deep and all the windows have replaced sills and surrounds. The exterior building material is aluminum siding and the gable roof has boxed trim and an open cornice. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. This building is typical of its community in that Southville Road has a string of residential buildings, most of which were constructed within the same time period.

This building was constructed during the Early Industrial Period (1830-1870) when Southborough's population increased as the Boston and Worcester Turnpike and the Boston-Worcester Railroad provided a means of transporting industry from Boston to more rural areas. Agriculture remained a large portion of Southborough's economy, but industrial villages arose in Southville and Cordaville, resulting in the construction of residential buildings along Southville Road to house the growing population of the town.
