



BUILDING FORM

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

Rising from a concrete foundation, 114 Southville Road is a-three-story, side-gable residence. The building is eleven bays deep and the windows, along with the sills and surrounds, are original. The wood frame exterior has vinyl-shingle siding, and there are paired interior brick chimneys on the ridge of the roof. The building is symmetrical, with three entrance doors on the facade. The center entrance has double doors with a flat pediment decoration. On the second story, two gable dormers are present on the west side. There is a shed-roofed enclosed porch and entrance in the center, west side, of the building. 114 Southville Road is a boarding house and lies in a residential area, but is unusual in its boarding house style.

114 Southville was constructed during the Early Industrial Period (1830-1870) when Southborough's population increased as the Boston and Worcester Turnpike and the Boston-Worcester Railroad provided a means of transporting industry from Boston to more rural areas in Massachusetts. Agriculture remained a large portion of Southborough's economy, but industrial villages arose in Southville and Cordaville. A result of these villages was the construction of residential buildings along Southville Road to house the growing population of the town.
